Trust and Transition By Pastor Martha Butzier

"My car doesn't do that!" she exclaimed when the car jumped to 60 mph in just a few seconds. I laughed and said, "I like a car with stealth and speed so that I can trust I will be able to pass cars quickly and scoot across a busy intersection like greased lightning."

Actually, much of driving a car is about trust for all of us. Think about it. We drive on roads at speeds in excess of 70 miles an hour. Cars, trucks, motorcycles, mopeds, and bicycles all use the same roadways. We pass cars at these high speeds with just a few feet of air in between. On two lane roads, on multi-lane roads, we trust that everyone will stay in their respective lane. For the most part, we are trusting that total strangers will do what we expect of them – use the roadways following all of the same rules that we follow. It's remarkable that we have this high degree of trust when it comes to driving our cars.

The question that springs to mind is this, "Do we have the same heightened trust in God?" When the sadness and brokenness of our lives leads us away from the green pastures into the dark valleys, are we walking the path confident in God's presence? We all know these opposites: green pastures and dark valleys, brokenness and peace, rejection and welcome, love and hate, and everything that falls in between. What happens to trusting God when we are run off the smooth pavement and into the potholes of life?

Lake Edge has bumped through a number of potholes and detours in the last few years. You have gone head on into change followed by times of transition. Psalm 23 promises *God's goodness surrounds us all the time* assuring us of unlimited abundance. No one else, nothing else can offer and fulfill that promise to us.

You have said goodbyes to three pastors in the past 18 months. It's an understatement to suggest these changes were all small bumps in the road. There were times when it must have felt like you had been forced over a cliff, and the car went up in flames due to the sparks generated in the crash landing. The Church Council made



difficult decisions, and some but not all did not agree with the road they chose. Some said, "Good riddance," and others, "I don't want you to leave." God was and is present and working with purpose during the process of these transitions. The Ministry Evaluation Task Force has been working diligently. We are no strangers to God who has been and will continue working in the hearts and minds of potential pastors to serve here at Lake Edge.

Will there be other changes here at Lake Edge? Probably. During this time of shifting gears at Lake Edge, the promises of God are still true. Through all the ups and downs, all the hills and valleys, God will be *faithfully working for good for Lake Edge*.

Call to Order by President Jonathan Pike at 6:47 p.m. Prayer & Bible Study: Pastor Mae Jean read verses from Exodus, chapter 3 where God speaks to Moses. God directs Moses to have faith to move forward when we can't see the future. The Council prayed.

BUSINESS

Financial Dashboard – Dale Dull, Interim Treasurer presented the financial dashboard and walked the Council through the categories of the report. Actual expenses are very close to the 2019 budget.

Pastor's Report- Pastor Martha felt the Children's program went very well. So far, the change to becoming a full time Pastor has gone well.

One concern is that Jason Xiong, Seminary Student and Lake Edge member has been leading the Confirmation but will have to step away to finish his studies. Pastor Martha suggest a plan for another Seminary student she has previously worked with could be hired for a very limited time (January – May) perhaps 5 hours per week to conduct the confirmation class and assist with the numerous visitations to Hospitals and other shut-in settings. Council referred this to the Lay Staff Support Committee for recommendations.

Pastor Martha reports that she will be away for two Sundays in January, but she has arranged for former Bishop George Carlson to provide ministry in her absence. A memorial for Rob Oehlkers is pending to occur sometime in February or March.

- 2. What skills and characteristics would serve in the person of the next bishop?
